

Important Message from the Principal Royalties Data Collection

The college is licensed to re-use copyright material such as print or digital **books**, **journals**, **magazines** and other CLA licensed resources. This means that whenever we, the staff, wish to re-use extracts from these publications — **photocopying**, **scanning**, **copy** & **paste**, **sharing or uploading on virtual platforms**, **etc.** - we can legitimately do so.

As part of CLA's work, they regularly collect data to find out which publications are being reused by education providers. CLA then pay royalties to the relevant authors, publishers and visual artists whose work has been re-used, as opposed to being bought. In certain schools, CLA also collects **newspaper** data on behalf of NLA.

Our college is one of those selected to inform CLA about our use of published material between 22nd April 2024 and 8th July 2024. This is not an audit nor an inspection, but it is something we are all obliged to cooperate with under the terms and conditions of our licence. This collective responsibility means that **all staff** are required to participate in full, ensuring all re-use of published material is recorded as outlined below. We will also be supporting the creators of the resources we use within the college. Please refer to the support materials provided by CLA to familiarise yourself with the process.

Using My Content online

Whenever you photocopy or scan from a book, journal, magazine, newspaper, etc. (original or copy of a copy) or copy/paste or re-use material from a website or digital publication you will need to:

- **Open the My Content tool**, the link for which you will receive by email shortly before the exercise starts. There are no usernames or passwords; everyone uses the same link so the data submitted is anonymous.
- **Select Submit Copying Information** to tell CLA what you copied and the type of resource used. My Content allows you to search for the right publication or you can enter the details yourself, using a combination of the ISBN (work identifier), title, author or publisher.
- **Click Next** to tell CLA how the material was used and how many students or colleagues it was shared with.
- Click Submit.
